### **What type of support is Legacy Foundation expecting from the schools?**

Upon acceptance to the program, each school will formally develop a philanthropy club (LCYIP Chapter). Each school will be required to have a school sponsor for the club. This sponsor will be required to attend a sponsor training session with Legacy and be available to attend all monthly meetings and events, approximately 2-6 hours per month (The time will vary based on monthly events). Additionally, the schools will be expected to promote the club with materials provided by Legacy.

### **What role does Legacy Foundation have in this program?**

Legacy Foundation will oversee all LCYIP chapters. The foundation will provide training and educational materials, schedule club guest speakers, host various community service projects, execute committee meetings and will be available for support and guidance. Additionally, Legacy will provide funds for students to make their own grants and execute community projects.

### **What type of events and activities will the club members participate in?**

The school year will be broken down into various topics regarding philanthropy, community service, and leadership. Students will learn various skills such as leadership, public speaking, critical thinking, grantmaking, teamwork, budgeting, and fundraising techniques. The students will have the opportunity to hear stories and learn from professionals in the nonprofit field. Additionally, members will participate and host community service projects and award grants to nonprofit organizations in Lake County.

### **Would the students need to pay a fee to become a member of the club?**

Legacy Foundation does not require a membership fee, just commitment and dedication to being an active member of the club! A donation will be requested from each participating student to help support the Lake County Youth Fund and keep the program sustainable.

### **How is the Lake County Youth in Philanthropy Program structured amongst schools? Will we be working together or is each school its own entity?**

While each school has its own club, the program as a whole is designed for all participating schools to work together. All participating schools will be invited to work on community service projects collectively. In addition, the program has 4 member committees (Governance, Service Project, Grants, and Executive) that will be made up of 1-2 student representatives from each participating school.

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
