March 13, 2020 — that's the most recent date that Legacy Foundation offices were fully staffed. We closed down that day and began a new way of working in response to the pandemic directive from the Governor of Indiana.

During this pandemic we have been creative in moving forward to improve the lives of Lake County residents and meet the needs of the agencies. We have maintained our momentum in strategic and responsive grantmaking, provided our donors with assistance to create 24 new philanthropic funds, and supported our scholarship recipients as they have dealt with the reality of a changed educational landscape.

We moved Forward Together and established the COVID-19 Emergency Response Fund, in partnership with Crown Point Community Foundation and Foundations of East Chicago. Collaboration helped us quickly raise over \$1 million for COVID-19 relief and support more than 60 organizations working to meet the needs of the residents in our region.

Most recently, with support from the John W. Anderson Foundation, Legacy Foundation partnered with Porter County Community Foundation and Lake Area/Porter County United Ways to coordinate food distribution for children and families within our two counties.

During this past year we have experienced not only the pain of the pandemic and social isolation but also the pain resulting from racial disparity and social injustice that has become so apparent. Legacy Foundation responded by developing an action focused commitment statement around Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Accessibility (I.D.E.A.). We have incorporated the action steps from this statement into our business model so that we are "walking the talk". Four other regional organizations – Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Northwest Indiana, Crossroads YMCA, Shirley Heinze Land Trust, and South Shore Arts - recognized the need for change and have joined us in developing plans to build equity and inclusion into their programs, service delivery, and governance. In addition, we are incorporating I.D.E.A. into our Transform Lake County grantmaking decisions.

Legacy Foundation matched a grant from Indiana Black Expo to provide \$50,000 to small business owners in East Chicago and Gary. The grants ranged from \$2,000-\$5,000 and were focused on minority/ women owned businesses that had suffered monetary losses due to the pandemic. More than 35 submitted applications for Legacy review. Over 20 businesses, many of which had been in existence for more than 30 years, received this financial support.

As we work together to build a community where everyone has an opportunity to thrive, we invite you to be a part of our commitment to equity. Nonprofit organizations interested in learning about diversity and inclusion in their places of work can take advantage of a training scholarship we created with the Urban League of Northwest Indiana. We launched Legacy's Conscious Conversations program, a series of monthly discussions on books and movies related to race. These discussions will continue throughout the year and we encourage people of all races to join us whether or not they have read the books or seen the movies.

Just like you, we look forward to attending community events in-person and spending time with our loved ones and neighbors safely. We now are focused on encouraging our residents to be fully vaccinated. Legacy is working with healthcare and social service agencies across the region to gather best ideas for reaching communities where there is a low percentage of vaccinations.

As I wrote last year, "these are troubling times no doubt". Through the partnerships we have developed and with your support we can continue to improve our Lake County communities using an equity lens. Thank you for your partnership.


Programs

Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Accessibility in Lake County (IDEAL) Initiative

As the world faced an unprecedented health pandemic in 2020, it also confronted the all too familiar epidemic of racism and injustice.

At Legacy Foundation, we reflected on the role we play in creating an inclusive community here in Lake County.

After a series of thoughtful and honest internal discussions, we put our words into actions and created a new initiative focused on developing principles of inclusion, diversity, equity, and accessibility. We took immediate steps and put a plan in place for long-term change, to uplift and prioritize racialized and marginalized people.



Nonprofit Training Scholarships

Legacy Foundation partnered with the IUPUI Lilly School of Philanthropy to offer training scholarships that helped further professional development and create stronger organizations. Scholarships covered 75% of the tuition for an online training for staff and board of Lake County nonprofit organizations. The scholarships gave priority to staff and board members who identified as Asian/Pacific Islander, Black, Hispanic/Latinx, Indigenous, or LGBTQ.

Urban League of Northwest Indiana Partnership

Legacy Foundation partnered with the Urban League of Northwest Indiana to support nonprofits in Lake County looking to provide diversity and inclusion training for their staff and board members. We provided a grant to supplement the cost of a 2-hour Diversity and Inclusion Professional Development training. Selected organizations had 20 members of their staff and board participate in a private session tailored to the organization's needs.

Internal Equity Assessments for Nonprofits

Legacy Foundation seeks to build organization leadership for inclusion, diversity, equity, and accessibility (IDEA) in Lake County. We invested \$38,550 of strategic grantmaking dollars into equity consulting group, Thrivance. The Thrivance Group will lead Legacy Foundation and four other organizations through a 10-month long training to develop strategies to implement IDEA practices into our internal policies, workplace cultures, and programs and services.












Neighborhood Voice Radio Segment

Lake County is home to many minority entrepreneurs who strengthen the local small business community. Legacy Foundation partnered with Lakeshore Public Radio 89.1 FM on the radio show *Neighborhood Voice* to bring those stories to the radio airwaves every week. We covered 18 small business owners who shared their journeys to entrepreneurship and how they adapted during the pandemic.

Conscious Conversations

In 2020, Legacy Foundation launched *Conscious Conversations* to highlight books, films, and podcasts that speak to the specific types of discrimination faced by Black people in America. Legacy Foundation staff invited community members to join them for virtual conversations, or host their own discussion groups, to talk about the selected stories as a means of understanding inequities and discrimination in our own communities.

Conscious Conversations and the library of equity resources are funded with a \$45,000 grant from the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation Donor Advised Fund.

2020 Census

Together We Count, Lake County

All residents count. It is a message Legacy Foundation wanted to reinforce with its outreach efforts for the 2020 Census. The decennial census affects community funding, congressional representation, and more because it provides critical data that is used to determine how much federal funding is needed to sustain a community. Billions of dollars go to schools, teachers, hospitals, lawmakers, business owners, fire departments, and many other organizations that provide daily services that support our communities.

Legacy Foundation's 2020 Census outreach connected neighborhood-based organizations and municipalities across Lake County, Indiana, with a specific focus on communities that often get undercounted. Legacy Foundation worked closely with the U.S. Census Bureau and community leaders to share resources and co-promote efforts to get everyone counted.

Funding for Census grants was provided by the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation Donor Advised Fund.

Being around for over 50 years, Playboy Barber Shop is an institution in Gary. Colby is the family's third generation to own and operate the shop, which was started by his grandmother and mother in 1965.



Lake County Eats Local

In its second year, the 2020 Lake County Eats Local (LCEL) farmers market season served communities with 15 markets in East Chicago and Gary.

The outdoor events gave shoppers the opportunity to pick-up fresh, locally grown onions, tomatoes, peppers and other produce safely. Over 40 vendors shared their made goods like honey, soap, and trail mix.

In addition to starting new markets in East Chicago and Gary, LCEL helped grow farmers markets in Crown Point and Munster. Through land-based and "On-the-Go" farmers markets, LCEL aims to make fresh food more affordable and accessible to residents. Plus, it helps local farmers increase revenue by providing marketing tools, the option to accept SNAP payments, and agricultural training.



LCEL is a program of the South Shore Neighborhood Development Corporation, funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers Market Promotional Program. Legacy Foundation is collaborating with Purdue University Cooperative Extension of Lake County, the NWI Food Council, the City of Gary's Department of Green Urbanism and Environmental Affairs, the City of East Chicago's Departments of Parks and Recreation and Planning and Development.


Partnership Grants
